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### Childbirth and Breastfeeding Support Demonstration (CBSD)

- TRICARE's new CBSD allows Certified Labor Doulas (CLD), lactation consultants or lactation counselors to provide care to eligible beneficiaries
- In the TRICARE East Region, the CBSD runs from January 1, 2022 to December 31, 2026 and eligible claims may be filed beginning April 2, 2022



# Who is eligible



#### Who is eligible

- CBSD is only for TRICARE Prime or Select enrollees
- Beneficiaries who are receiving maternity care at a military hospital or clinic — or whose deliveries are scheduled at a network facility based on the military facility's External Resource Sharing Agreement (ERSA) program — are not covered under the CBSD
- While referrals are not required, Prime enrollees need a referral from their Primary Care Manager (PCM) or physician to see a non-network provider; Point-of-Service (POS) charges may apply without a referral

To qualify for CLD services, beneficiaries must:

- Be enrolled in TRICARE Prime or TRICARE Select
- Be at least 20 weeks pregnant
- See a TRICARE-authorized provider for their birth event

To qualify for lactation/breastfeeding support services, beneficiaries must:

- Be enrolled in TRICARE Prime or TRICARE Select
- Be at least 27 weeks pregnant
- Qualify for TRICARE's breastfeeding support benefit

## Definition of provider types



### Definition of provider types

#### Labor doulas:

 Trained, non-medical professionals who provide support for the birthing parent before, during and a short time after labor

Lactation counselors:

- Non-medical professionals who provide breastfeeding counseling to support normal lactation and breastfeeding parents
- Non-network lactation counselors must meet certain qualifications
- Can provide either individual or group breastfeeding support services under the demonstration



#### Definition of provider types (cont.)

Lactation consultants:

- Non-medical professionals who provide a full range of breastfeeding care, including support for breastfeeding complications
- Non-network lactation consultants must meet certain qualifications
- Can provide either individual or group breastfeeding support services under the demonstration

Group breastfeeding counseling:

- Individual breastfeeding counseling by other TRICARE providers may already be covered under TRICARE's breastfeeding benefit
- Group breastfeeding counseling must be run by a:
  - Lactation consultant
  - Lactation counselor
  - TRICARE-authorized provider
- Group breastfeeding counseling also includes prenatal breastfeeding education

### Covered services



#### Covered services

- Certified Labor Doula (CLD) services for pregnant beneficiaries with a gestational age over 20 weeks
  - The beneficiary must be under the care of a TRICARE-authorized provider (obstetrician, certified nurse midwife, etc.) for the maternity episode of care for CLD services to be covered under the demonstration
  - TRICARE will cover up to six visits by a CLD before or after giving birth, as well as one continuous labor support encounter during the birth event
  - CLD services for beneficiaries who give birth at a military hospital or clinic are excluded from the demonstration



### Provider enrollment



#### Provider enrollment

Lactation consultant must:

- Be at least 18 years old
- Hold a current certification as a lactation consultant by one of the following organizations:
  - International Board of Lactation Consultant Examiners
  - Academy of Lactation Policy and Practice, Inc.
- Be licensed by state or local jurisdiction, if offered
- Have current CPR certification
- Have a National Provider Identifier (NPI) number

Lactation counselor must:

- Be at least 18 years old
- Hold a current certification as a certified lactation counselor by Academy of Lactation Policy and Practice, Inc.
- Be licensed by state or local jurisdiction, if offered
- Have a current CPR certification
- Have an NPI number

#### Provider enrollment (cont.)

Certified Labor Doula (CLD) must:

- Be at least 18 years old
- Have attended a minimum of 24 education hours to include:
  - The physiology of labor
  - Labor doula training
  - Antepartum doula training
  - Postpartum doula training
- Have attended one or more breastfeeding courses
- Have attended one or more childbirth classes
- Be licensed by state or local jurisdiction, if offered
- Hold a current CPR certification
- Have an NPI number

#### Provider enrollment (cont.)

- Within the last three years:
  - Provided continuous in-person childbirth support for at least three childbirths as the primary labor doula supporting birthing parent, with a minimum of 15 hours over the three childbirths (two of three must have been vaginal birth)
  - Provided antepartum and postpartum support for at least one birth
  - Earned a certification as a CLD, certified doula or similar perinatal certification obtained within the last three years from one of the following organizations:
    - BirthWorks International
    - Childbirth and Postpartum Professional Association
    - Doulas of North America (DONA) International
    - International Childbirth Education Association
    - <u>toLabor</u>

#### Provider enrollment (cont.)

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#### Helpful tips to avoid rejection of your certification

Doulas should include the following:

- A current DONA membership
- Current (not expired) BLS/CPR
- Current certificates (i.e. CLD, certified doula, or similar perinatal certification)

\*DONA – Approved Birth Doula Training Workshop

Lactation consultants and lactation counselors should include:

- A copy of the state license
- Current (not expired) BLS/CPR
- Correct provider type
- Board certification document
- Find dx codes

## Provider reimbursement



#### Provider reimbursement

Cost-shares, copayments and deductibles don't apply to covered breastfeeding/lactation counseling services. POS fees may apply for TRICARE Prime beneficiaries who see non-network providers without a referral. Breastfeeding support services

- Individual lactation counseling sessions shall be reimbursed at the non-physician, non-facility CHAMPUS Maximum Allowable Charge (CMAC) under the existing *CPT codes 99401 to 99404 (15, 30, 45 and 60 min)*
- Group lactation consulting shall be reimbursed at the non-physician, non-facility CMAC under the existing CPT codes 99411 (30 min) and 99412 (60 min). Use of either CPT code counts as one session towards the sixsession limit
- Taxonomy designations:
  - **163WL0100**X Lactation consultant (if an RN)
  - **174N00000X** Lactation consultant (if not an RN)
  - **174400000X** Lactation counselor (if the National Uniform Claims Committee creates a taxonomy designation specific to lactation counselors, that taxonomy designation shall be used)
  - Other appropriate HIPAA taxonomy based on license/certification

#### Provider reimbursement

Childbirth support services:

- Gestational age must be over 20 weeks to qualify for the demonstration and this must be noted on the claim to ensure proper reimbursement/claims processing
- CLD services not personally performed will not be reimbursed
- Antepartum and postpartum support visits are untimed and reimbursed using CPT code 99509. Up to six combined antepartum and postpartum visits are allowed
- Continuous labor support visits are untimed and reimbursed using CPT code 59899. Only one continuous labor support visit per birth event will be reimbursed

- Taxonomy designation: CLD: **374J00000X**
- Current rates can be found at <u>Health.mil/rates</u>
- Rendering provider's name and address
- Telemedicine/Telehealth services are allowed for all except 59899 code, and must include the correct place of service and the correct modifier.


